# FNET Member Survey – Extending Deadline to 4th June

## Why

- It's important for FNET to evaluate if the network is effective at delivering against the Theory of Change.
- The survey aims to assist members in assessing the structure, priorities, and resources of their responsible Sourcing programs.
- We will be able to identify industry trends, best practices, and potential areas to reduce duplication, align approaches and increase impact with the intended outcome for more members to implement responsible business practices which in turn will improve conditions for workers.

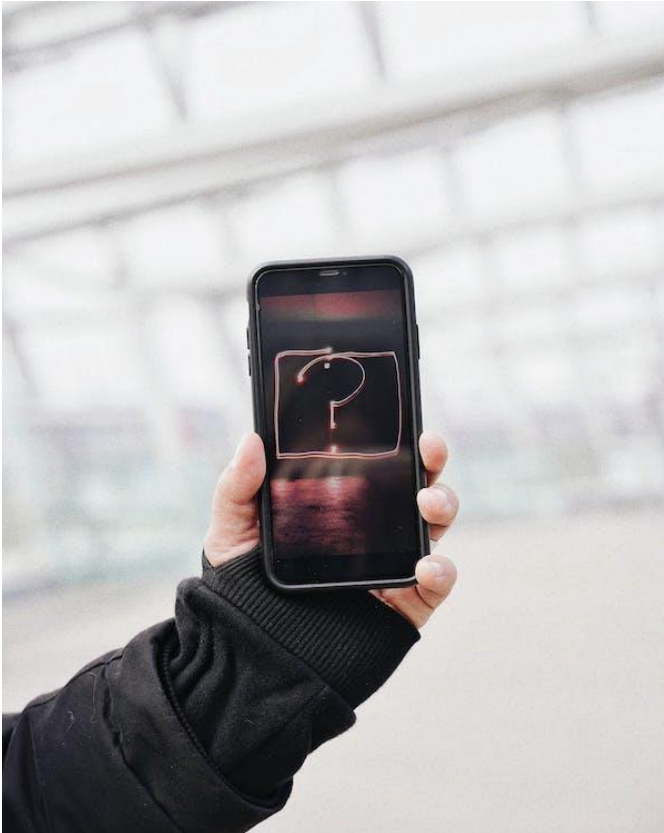
## What

- The survey includes 32 questions and is designed to follow the [FNET human rights due diligence reporting framework](#). Its split in 7 sections as laid out in FNET DD reporting framework
  - A. Embed responsible business practices into policies and management systems
  - B. Traceability
  - C. Assessment of actual and potential adverse impacts on people
  - D. Taking Action: Prevention and Mitigation
  - E. Tracking Performance
  - F. Remedy
  - H. Communication
- Average time to complete is less than 2 hours. Format designed to make it easy to complete and evaluate.
- **The information requested relates to the calendar year 2023 or if your annual year runs financial year April 23 to March 2024 or equivalent**

## Who has access?

- **Only the FNET technical team will have access to individual company responses. All outputs will be aggregated and not attributed to any business**
- The person who is completing the survey is asked for an email address, this is so at the end you receive a completed copy of the survey for your records.
